## What Are the College Now! eLearning Opportunities for High School Students?

The College Now! eLearning Partnership for High School Students allows a learner to earn both high school and college credit for the same course. Jefferson Community & Technical College (JCTC) and Jefferson County Public Schools (JCPS) have partnered to provide this educational opportunity. A college credit transcript will be generated by the Kentucky Community and Technical College System (KCTCS) upon completion of coursework.

### Can I Transfer KCTCS Credit From College Now! to Other Postsecondary Institutions?

Students must verify acceptance with the institution they plan to attend, because each institution of higher education determines which academic courses it will accept as transfer credit. College Now! credit is accepted at all Kentucky public colleges and universities. Please request in writing or via the KCTCS Web site that an official transcript be mailed to the receiving postsecondary institution.

### How Do I Qualify for the College Now! Program?

High school students (students attending public, private, parochial, and home schools) must meet the following requirements:

- The applicant must have junior or senior high school status to participate.
- The applicant shall have a required minimum ACT score or COMPASS score. Please check specifics for each course on the College Now! Web site.
- The applicant shall have approval by his or her high school counselor or principal.

### Registration

Refer to the Web site for the latest information. For forms and payment online, go to <http://college-now.com> and select the application link.

### Withdrawals and Refunds

A student may withdraw from a course at any time prior to the course expiration date. A refund of the tuition will be made, less a \$55 processing fee per course, only if a student withdraws and applies for the refund within 30 days from the date of course enrollment. No refunds will be made past the 30-day period. A student who withdraws from a course will receive a W on his or her college transcript.

### Grades and Time Limits

- The maximum completion time for each course is 120 days. If the student's counselor requires an earlier completion date, it must be indicated on the enrollment application.
- Coursework grading scales will be posted in each course syllabus.
- The proctored final examination must be completed at least one week before the high school grade for the course is issued and up to one month before the college credit is posted on the transcript.
- Upon completion of a course, students will be notified of their grade. College Now! will send a copy of the grade report to the school official indicated on the Approval Form.

### Final Examination

- The final examination can be scheduled only when all the assigned coursework has been completed successfully.
- On the final examination, administered by an approved proctor, a student must earn a score of at least 70 percent. **A student must pass the final examination to receive credit for the course.**
- **The final examination score counts as one-fourth of the total course grade. Coursework counts as three-fourths of the total course grade.**

## Logging On to Your College Now! Course



After a student receives notification of enrollment in College Now! via e-mail, the student should launch his/her Internet browser, enter <http://college-now.com>, and click on **Log On**.

The student should enter his or her username and password, which are issued upon notification of enrollment.

Once this data is entered, the student should select the **Log On** button.

If the log-on is successful, the student will be greeted by a homepage that recognizes him or her by his or her username. Important note: The password should be changed the first time the student logs on. The student should go to **Settings** and click on **Change Password**. From there, the student should follow the easy online instructions.

While there are many **College Now!** features to explore, the student's main focus will be the course(s) for which he or she is registered.

From the left menu bar, click on the link labeled **Courses**.

The next screen includes a listing of all courses in which the student is enrolled.

Click on the **course name** to enter the course. Information about the course is located under the **tabs** along the upper edge of the screen. An introduction to **eLearning** is located in each course.
